
What is a body?

Using materials in unique ways, the artists create works that are both hard and soft, thick and thin, transparent* and translucent*, moving and still. The exhibition title Grossly Affectionate pushes us to think about these opposites—the artworks can be funny and strange, beautiful and surprising all at the same time.

Daisy May Collingridge

Daisy May Collingridge's "squishies" are charming characters that hop, skip, and dance their way into our hearts. Her art is part sculpture and part performance. These bodysuits celebrate all sizes, encouraging us to think about how bodies look on the inside and the outside. and how bodies move around in the world.



Pretending to be made of marshmallows







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
Mr. Hanimal

Mr. Hanimal makes us smile with his multicolored "hanimals." These half-hand, half-animal hybrid* species are frozen in strange positions that can't possibly be real hands. Having fingernails for faces, they might make you think about monsters or insects crawling across the floor. Yikes! But, because they are brightly colored, they are somehow funny, playful, and friendly at the same time.








Kate Casanova

Kate Casanova is inspired by organisms and cells, especially by the membrane (the outer layer that separates the inside from the outside.) She thinks about how our bodies are affected by the outside world, and how they change and adapt. For instance, is your body the same when it's running as when it's sleeping? Kate creates her abstract species using lots of different materials that she often finds in thrift stores.

Sofie Ramos transforms old toys, furniture, and other things that have been thrown away into imaginative installations*. Sofie paints objects with bright colors and stacks them on top of each other to form a room-sized artwork that is larger than life. She also creates stopmotion animations* that show the objects and furniture moving around the room. What do you think she is trying to say with her installation and animation?

*Word Glossary:

Affectionate - Showing feelings of liking or loving

Body - The whole physical structure that forms a being

Grossly - Extremely

Hybrid - Made up of two or more things that come together to make something new

Installation (in art) - A collection of objects, sounds, or movements arranged together

Stop Motion Animation - Individual images that show very slight movements pieced together to make a film

Translucent - Something you can partially see through (such as frosted glass)

Transparent - Something you can completely see through (such as clear glass)
